Following his discharge from the Army in 1971, Mr. M enrolled in the College of Staten Island.

That same year he married Rosalie, and they were the proud parents of a son and daughter. The marriage ended in 1991. His daughter has since provided him with two grandsons, the family remains close, including supporting his life in the gay community.

Mr. M worked for many years at Procter & Gamble, also on Staten Island. The manufacturing plant produced Crisco oil, Duncan Hines cake mix, and the company's signature product, Ivory Soap. He was offered a retirement buyout in 1989 in anticipation of the plant's closing in 1991. He found himself at a gay owned insurance agency called Greystone Insurance as an agent. They insured many of the most famous gay businesses in NYC. It was also during this period that he did some modeling and acting, appearing in several commercials. His next career move was to Maintech, Inc., which provided IT services to large corporations. After 23 years as a purchasing agent for the company, he was again offered a buyout, and

retired in 2016.

Mr. M attributes 1989 to his coming out in the gay community in NYC, where he met his partner Keith of five years, and with whom he purchased a condo in Forrest Hills, Queens. As far back as his childhood, he developed a love of classic cars. During this period, he was able to live out his classic car passion. Over the years he has participated in several gay classic car clubs like the Lambda Car Club, and drove several different models of these cars in various Gay Pride parades in the northeast.

Mr. M moved to South Florida in 2016, at first, staying with his sister and brother in law while looking for his own place. He enjoys his participation at the Sunshine Cathedral and programs at the Equality Center, and, of course, Prime Gentlemen!
