

# GENTLEMAN OF THE MONTH

The Supreme Court affirmed a woman's right to choose in passing Roe v. Wade in 1973. And the World Trade Center became the tallest building in the world, while Spiro Agnew, Vice President under Richard Nixon, resigned in October.

On October 7 of that year, Mr. April was born i n Managua, Nicaragua. He joined the family as the second oldest boy, followed by a sister and two additional brothers.

At 13, the family moved to Costa Rica where he worked for 3



years. When 16 years of age, he called Los Angeles home and in 1993 he graduated from HS having taken ESL classes to master English.

Mr. A then enlisted in the US Marine Corps, stationed at Camp Pendleton, CA and trained in an artillery unit at Camp Sill, Oklahoma.

After his discharge in 1997, he enrolled at El Camino Community College, in Torrance, CA and following a few semesters transferred to the University of Southern California with majors in premed and history. A highlight for him was singing with the university choir's performance in 2000 of Messiah at Carnegie Hall in NYC!

Following his graduation in 2002, he worked as an assistant lab director in a nanotech synthesizing lab that analyzed DNA strands for Ph.D. students at NYU and at a brokerage house for 3 years.

In 2006, Mr. A met Bob DeBenedictis, who was an entrepreneur, investor and philanthropist. His business model involved investing in facilities with hardworking undercapitalized people who added their own skills. He invested in NYC's Townhouse Piano Bar and East Side Sauna, as well as LIPS and Tropics in Wilton Manors, among hundreds of other ventures.

Mr. A started working for Bob by managing several of his properties, all while going to Columbia Business School and getting a degree in executive education.

In 2008, he started managing some hotel properties in the Ft. Lauderdale area and

became involved with a unique business. "The Belles Answering Service" started in 1956 and catered to some of the biggest names in show business.

After the service had been open for just a short time, celebrity lyricist Adolph Green and songwriter Jule Styne, clients of founder "Ma Belle," told her they were going to write a Broadway musical about the business. The result was the Broadway production of "The Bells Are Ringing." Mr. A bought the business and made major upgrades to modernize it.

He also had a long and loving friendship with Tom, who became very ill and depended on Mr. A for his care. Tom passed on in 2021. In the midst of all this, Mr. A managed to go to night classes at The Juilliard School in NYC and studied voice, piano and music theory!

Mr. A and Bob were together for 15 years until Bob's passing in 2021 when he was 87 years old. With Bob's passing, Mr. A moved from Gramercy Park in Manhattan to Pompano Beach.

He was introduced to Prime Gentlemen through his friend AJ and he also joined the Gay Men's Chorus of South Florida. He's looking forward to the next chapter in his interesting life.


