a discussion leader who would provide a brief introduction to the chosen topic as well as be a facilitator to guide the conversation. The idea of inviting outside speakers was also suggested. The proposal was submitted to the (then) Prime Timers and SAGE boards, seeking their sponsorship. Upon receiving approval from the boards, members from both groups were recruited. Within a short period, nearly two dozen individuals had agreed to participate. The inaugural meeting took place at the Pride Center on December 5, 2016.

The group experienced immediate success, with a small core of members providing collective leadership and delivering most of the presentations. Presenters from outside the group added to this mix. Over time, presentations based on personal experiences were included, which further contributed to the popularity of the group. In the spring of 2020, with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the group could no longer convene in person so it transitioned to online meetings using the Zoom platform. The online format offered the added advantage of enabling participants and presenters from around the world to join. In April 2022, as pandemic restrictions eased, the group introduced Zoom hybrid meetings, allowing members to gather either in person at the Pride Center or join via Zoom. Current meetings are held using this hybrid format.



GENTLEMAN OF THE MONTH

Franklin Roosevelt won an unprecedented fourth term as President in 1944.

Aaron Copland's ballet score, "Appalachian Spring" premiered, with Martha Graham in the leading role, and Holocaust diarist Anne Frank was sent to Auschwitz.

World War II raged on, however. US troops captured the first large German city and the D-Day invasion commenced on June 1st. The 16th Academy Award's Best Picture 'Oscar' went to *Casablanca* and Billboard's top ten included, the Harry James Orchestra's, *I'll Get By.*

Then, in St. Louis on August 7th, Mr. June joined his family of parents, brother and sister. Two other

brothers followed. They lived in a suburb called Webster Groves where Mr. J attended Avery GS and Webster Groves HS, graduating in 1962. During his HS years, he was active in the Hi-Y (YMCA) club as Secretary/Treasurer.



Next, he was on to Drake University in



Des Moines, IA where he majored in economics and enjoyed membership in the Alpha Kappa Psi business fraternity. He graduated in 1966. He moved on to the University of Missouri School of Law but after one year decided to go to night school and earn a second degree in accounting instead.

In 1996, he started his first job with the Federal Aeronautical Chart and Information Center in St. Louis, as a map maker. After only a few months he was summarily dismissed when his bosses found out he was gay. This painful event led him to employment with IBM as part of a sales team installing mainframe computers for major corporations. After a year, he started using his accounting skills at the Graham Paper Company, a familyowned, St. Louis-based corporation started in 1880. He worked there for two years.

Mr. J's father, William, was the CEO of the family dental supply business, the Thau-Nolde Dental Supply Company which was started by his father, Charles, in 1909. By 1970, it faced hard times so Mr. J and some of his siblings were asked to join the company. The new leadership helped restore the company's health and even opened a branch facility. Mr. J became the

company comptroller.

In 1996, they decided it was a good time to sell the company. It was purchased by the Patterson Dental Corporation where Mr. J continued to work for the next four years as Operations Manager. Owning a rather healthy amount of company stock, Mr. J decided to retire in 2000.

Around this period Mr. J found an interest in horsemanship, bought a steed, and was proud of the numerous ribbons it won in competition.

Though he was retired, Mr. J remained active by working for the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") as an accountant for the next four years.

Mr. J met his first partner, Vince, at a local gay bar in 1972. He was Mr.J's senior by 27 years. They shared their lives for 26 years and their home for 23 of them until Vince passed in 1998.

Mr. J also had the wonderful experience of being accepted and loved by his whole family as a gay man. In fact, one aunt, a nephew and a brother were also "members of the tribe!"

Mr. J found a new partner, Gene, in 1998. Unfortunately, Gene became the victim of Alzheimer's in 2014. Mr. J was his devoted caregiver until Gene's 2017 death.

Mr. J and his partners were frequent "snowbirds" to South Florida over the years. In 2005, Mr. J bought a condo here. He and Gene "commuted" between it and their home in Chesterfield, MO. Mr. J enjoys his participation in the SAGE and Prime Gentlemen collectors group, weekly mixers and monthly dinners. He is also an active member of St. Nicholas Episcopal Church in Pompano Beach.

No meetings during June, July, and August. Meetings will resume in September.


