





Minute for minute, you won't find a more romantic gay film this year than this British rugby drama. It's a surprisingly moving sports-team story slathered in sweat, streaked with mud and dripping with sensuality.

As a "B Squad" of gay athletes tries to overcome inexperience and push past rivalries to score an elusive win, a secret affair simmers among them. Mark (puppyeyed Alexander Lincoln) finds himself unable to avoid the blazing appeal of teammate Warren (Alexander King) with his cocky attitude and emotional unavailability. Following a drunken encounter, the two equally attached men




from a cash-strapped and divided gay rugby club glide into an adulterous affair, but must conceal their growing feelings or risk destroying the rugby club they both love. With well-written characters, a truly engaging story and strong performances, "In From The Side" is without a doubt the best gay film that's been released in a while. GENTLEMAN OF THE MONTH

President Harry Truman signed the Marshall Plan into law in 1948, while NYC hiked its subway fare to 10 cents. Mahatma Gandhi was also assassinated by a Hindu extremist and Israel declared independence from British rule.

In the same year, on June 10th, a new star, Mr. May, was born, as the only child of a couple in Forest Hills, Queens, NY.

He was born into a "show biz" family. His mother, Frances, was one of "The Byrne

Sisters," a song and



dance trio that became the opening act for George Burns, Milton Berle and Jack Benny on the vaudeville circuit. It was a career the sisters enjoyed for two decades. His father was their chauffeur.

As a young child, his mom took him to a Broadway show every Friday night. The first was "Peter Pan," starring Mary Martin. Mom escorted him backstage—his first celebrity introduction. He told Ms. Martin he truly believed in "fairies" and they hugged.

At that tender age, he was "hooked" and asked his parents to be enrolled in piano, singing and dancing lessons. The family

moved to Fort Lee, NJ where Mr. M continued private classes while attending Fort Lee HS and was busily engaged in the performing arts programs-music and drama. A youthful highlight was his piano solo of "Rhapsody in Blue" in the NJ pavilion at the 1964-65 New York World's Fair. He was just 13 years old, but he wore white tails like a "Liberace wannabe."

Mr. M graduated in 1966 with a successful college audition to Glassboro State College. He earned an undergraduate degree in speech and drama there, followed by a graduate degree in theatre from Villanova University, Philadelphia. He taught acting and directed hundreds of shows at Cherry Hill HS East, in NJ over a 37-year career and was the recipient of several awards for his exemplary musical theater directing.

However, he was off across the river to Broadway in the evenings. He earned his Actor's Equity card and worked backstage at numerous theatrical productions, lincluding "The Fantasticks."

He even became a member of the creative team for the musical, "A Tale of Two Cities" which opened in 2008 in Sarasota, FL. After hiring a new director, the show opened at the Hirschfield Theatre

on Broadway but it only ran for 4 months. He had worked on that production for over two years and recalls that the disappointment of an early closing truly motivated his retirement from the Great White Way, as well as from teaching.

Mr. M decided to move to South Florida, where his parents owned a vacation home, in 2010. Here he has continued his passion for the arts by teaching theater at Charles Flanagan HS in Pembroke Pines for several years and opening a black box theatre in Ft Lauderdale, *Andrews Living Arts Studio*. After Hurricane Irma ruined the building, he spent time writing a few plays and searching for a new venue to keep alive his Mom's legacy of preserving 20th Century Broadway Memorabilia.

His search materialized with the opening of *Behind the Scenes Theatricals* in Ft. Lauderdale, which is home to the *Artist Sanctuary of Ft. Lauderdale*, a non-profit theatrical museum and resource center, along with a small performance space. He also has a theater costume rental business there, with more than 7,000 Broadway costumes and props, mostly collected by his mom over her long career.

Mr. M believes that the real measure of a teacher's impact is how well his students fare in their life's journey. He is very proud of the dozens of his students who have succeeded by becoming Tony-nominated performers in major Broadway productions like "Phantom of the Opera," "Once" and "The Lion King."
