If we had such a person he would pick a play, make a good deal with the manager of the theater, and pick a date and

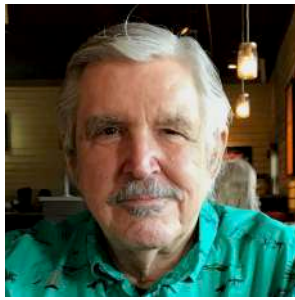

The next SAGE/Prime Gentlemen Monthly Movie will be the much anticipated cinematic return of Downton Abbey.

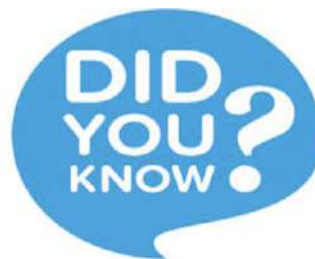
It will be shown in the Main Hall of the Pride Center on Friday, September 16 at 1:30 pm. Free popcorn and soda will be available!!

GENTLEMAN OF THE MONTH

The first meeting of the UN General Assembly convened in London in 1946. Also, Winston Churchill's "Iron Curtain" speech drew attention to the East/West divisions growing in Europe. Irving Berlin's musical "Annie Get Your Gun," starring Ethel Merman and featuring "There's No Business Like Show Business," opened on Broadway in NYC.

And, on April 8th of that same year, our Mr. September was born in Port Jervis, NY, the family's second child. His older sister has since passed on. Mr. S spent some time in elementary school in Matamoras, PA but finished his Jr. High and HS matriculation at the Delaware Valley school and graduated in 1964.

Mr. S had a love of music and looked to chart the path of a professional church musician. He enrolled in the Westminster Choir College, in Princeton, NJ, but left after one year, realizing he was



not at the same level as other students. He then moved to Manhattan, NY to seek training at the Guilmant Organ School where a similar revelation overcame him. Since he also had always loved to work with

children, he then attended both Mercer Community College and Trenton State Teachers College, and graduated in 1974 with a degree in elementary education.

During his "school years" he met Kathleen. They married in 1969, had three daughters (2 of which happened to be lesbian) and became grandparents to two girls and a boy. At Kathleen's death in 1998, they had been married for 29 years.

In 1973, he moved to Fort Lauderdale to work in the Florida School System. For the next 22 years, Mr. S taught in several elementary schools. To end this part of his professional life, he then became certified as a school administrator, as a master of training and development of teachers. In fact, he started his own company and for three years became a trainer of trainers. He conducted workshops in the U.S., including five Florida counties.

Mr. S had always felt "the call" to ministry. The path to priesthood in the Episcopal Church usually requires three years of study at a seminary to be ordained. For several reasons, including financial ones, Mr. S could not attend a traditional seminary. Through his response to his call, and his determination and ingenuity, he arranged with the Bishop to become educated locally by mentor priests and

local religious institutions. All candidates must pass the general ordination exam, which he did. On All Saints Day in 2002, at the Fort Lauderdale All Saints parish, he was ordained into the Episcopal Church. For the next nine years, he served the congregation at All Saints Episcopal parish in Fort Lauderdale. He retired in 2011.

Mr. S met his partner Rob in 2006, who was then living in Atlanta. They lived there for four months before they moved to Fort Lauderdale where they made a home together for 13 years. They were married for 11 years. In 2019, while they were enjoying a cruise, a horrible accident occurred on board ship that took Rob's life.

For the last 11 years Mr. S has been a volunteer Associate Pastor at the St. Nicholas Episcopal Church in Pompano Beach. He describes the congregation as a vibrant community of love! He has assisted with several church programs there and is particularly proud of his re-organization of the Bingo evening as a ministry of hospitality as well as stewardship for the congregation. He revels in his retirement as a way to strengthen ministry to the community.

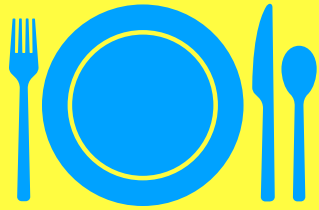
Mr. S has known about Prime Gentlemen for years, but just recently joined. He enjoys all the programs but especially bowling with his boyfriend and new buddies.
