Jim is a seventeen-year-old boxer in a small town preparing for a fight that will elevate him to professional status. His father, Stan, is a demanding coach and a notorious



alcoholic. In town, Stan is treated like a joke

but he's given everything to see his son gain professional status and escape the brutality of his small world.

Jim's life tangles with Whetu, a razortongued, gay, indigenous boy who spends his days in an old shack.

The stifling homophobia of small-town New Zealand permeates this heartfelt drama. Punch is a tough, moving and confident piece of film-making.



Pretty Boy is an award-winning coming of age story of a young bullied teen, Sean, struggling with his sexuality, the hardships of high school, and a Christian father

who will go to any lengths to get his son to find the light and 'perform' the way a man should. It's is a short film about confidence, finding inner strength, acceptance and being who you're meant to be.



GENTLEMAN OF THE MONTH

On the 8th of May, 1945, V-E Day (Victory in Europe Day) was celebrated in Scotland and throughout the world. The end of WWII finally came on the 15th of August with the celebration of V-J Day (Victory over Japan Day). Later that year, Scotsman Alexander Fleming was awarded the Nobel Prize in Medicine. Richard Henderson was born that year, too, and would become a molecular biologist, winning the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 2017.

Joining these famous Scots on the 13th of January, Mr. September was born in Glasgow, followed by his sister in 1950.



Mr. S spent his early family life in his hometown of Beith (near Glasgow), where he attended elementary through high schools and graduated in 1962. Mr. S believes that his small class sizes (no more than 9) in elementary school were a great foundation for his education.

He moved on to attend the University of Glasgow where he majored in Spanish and French. He graduated in 1969, after spending a year abroad in Paris!

Mr. S started his working life with the Bank of London and South America and was sent to Barcelona, Spain for a twoyear training program, six months of which was spent in Madrid. The rest of this two years there were spent working at the bank's Inspection Department with visits to many overseas branches, including one in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. By 1974, Mr. S was assigned to Managua, Nicaragua for two years, before the Sandinista Revolution. In 1976, after a temporary assignment in Bogota, Columbia, he was transferred to New York City and then in 1977, to Chicago.

By 1982 he was back at the Managua branch, whose operations were curtailed by the Sandinista government. A highlight of this stay was Mr. S's invitation to a dinner party where one of the guests was Bianca Perez Macias whose family was Nicaraguan and who was formerly married to Mick Jagger.

During 1985-86 he was assigned to the Cayman Island branch where the lack of basic accounting technology proved to be a serious challenge. It was also at this time that Cayman experienced its first case of AIDS. It was not well handled; hopefully lessons have been learned.

He finished his bank career in 1988 with his last assignment back in New York City. He moved to Tampa for a year and then enrolled in Florida State University at

Tallahassee where he earned a Master's degree in Library Science in 1990. After graduation, he was employed by the Miami-Dade Public Library.

In early 1992, he returned to Scotland to support his father who was in failing health.

When he came back from Scotland in September of 1992 he went to Houston. Texas where he earned increasingly more responsible positions at the city's public library. He worked at the Harris County Public Library (also in Houston) from 2002 until 2004 when he went to the Round Rock Public Library outside Austin.

He retired in 2008 and moved to Pompano Beach in 2013.

Mr. S says he was "a little late" in the coming out process.

He was a Prime Timers member in Houston, Austin and nearby San Antonio, and participated in many of their events, including the Oklahoma City Labor Day weekend, many Prime Timers Worldwide conventions, Celebration of Friends events (where he met his dear friend, Bill) and weekends at South Padre Island.

Mr. S now enjoys many Prime Gentlemen activities as well as his home in Palm Aire.

He shares this quote from Alexander Pope: "The proper study of mankind is man."

ONLINE ROMANCE SCAMS

The internet has revolutionized dating, and there has been a surge in U.S. adults using apps to find ideal matches postpandemic. While these apps offer convenience for connecting with romantic partners, they also open the door to online romance scams. Criminals create both deceptive profiles and urgent scenarios to carry out the scam.

How online romantic scams work

Online romance scams are not coincidental. They're carefully planned schemes that follow distinct stages. Research has identified five stages:

- Baiting victims with attractive profiles.
- Grooming victims with intimacy.
- Creating crises to extract money.
- On occasion manipulating victims with blackmail.
- Revealing the scam.

In short, scammers do not swindle victims by chance. They plan their actions in advance, patiently following their playbooks to ensure profitable outcomes. Scammers worm their way into a victim's heart to gain access to their money through false pretenses.

Scammers across four groups – *hosts*, resources, IT and money laundering persuade victims through romantic tactics to invest in fake apps or use fake gambling websites, convincing them to

pay more and more without ever receiving their money back.

Hosts interact with victims.

Resources members identify targets and collect information about them.

IT creates the fake apps and websites. *Money launderers* process the ill-gotten gains.

How to protect yourself

Online dating app users can take precautions when talking to strangers.

There are five rules users should follow to steer clear of scammers:

- Avoid sharing financial information with or sending money to strangers.
- Refrain from sending private photos 2. to strangers.
- Pay attention to spelling and grammar because scammers often claim to reside in English-speaking countries when they actually operate in non-Western countries.
- Use image and name-reverse searches.
- Confide in family and friends if you grow suspicious.

One last piece of advice to empower those who have fallen victim to online romance scams: Don't blame yourself.

Take the courageous step of breaking free from the scam and seek support. Reach out to your loved ones, trustworthy thirdparty organizations and law enforcement agencies for help. This support network is essential in helping you restart your life and move forward.


